18. Glyph of shell and kin elements. Pal. Inscr. (M), J8, D5.



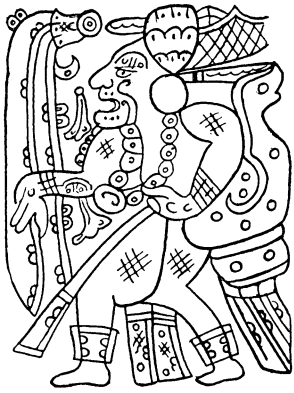
