

Monuments of Yaxchilan: Lintel 47*

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Context: Found in 1931 in two pieces during the Fourteenth Central American Expedition, in front of the second doorway from the northeast façade of Structure 12 (Graham 1979:103; Tate 1992:169). Originally, Lintels 48, 47, and 34 were placed above the southeast doorways of Structure 12, to the left of Lintel 36. The latter very likely represents K'inich Tatbu Jol II and served to distinguish this series from the other narrative sequence comprised by Lintels 60, 49, 37, and 35 on the other side of the northeast façade of the building.

Dimensions: MW 0.68 m, HSc 0.97 m, WSc 0.55 m, MTh 0.25 m, Rel 0.7 cm (Graham 1979:103).

This monument is the continuation of Lintel 48, completing its Long Count with a Lunar Series and haab notation. The date corresponds to 2 Cib 19 Pax (9.4.11.8.16, 12 February AD 526) and the accession of K'inich Tatbu Jol II. The rest of the text is comprised of an obscure and complex, and consequently still poorly understood parentage statement for the king. On the following Lintel 34 appears a list of deities including GI, the Wind God, and the Maize God (Juun Ixiim), among others, which are somehow connected to the previous ruler, Yaxuun Bahlam II. The same structure is attested on Lintels 20 and 19 from Structure 22, also from the time of K'inich Tatbu Jol II.

It Paat Yipyajel, ... is the son of father of ... K'in Tahn K'ew(eel), the son of mother of Yopaat ... is ..., K'inich Tatbu Jol II, lord of Pa'chan."
