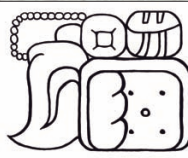

Maya site names are capitalized. If known, the ancient name is shown first, with the modern name in parentheses.

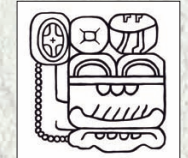
Other names are in initial capitals and lower case, with alternate names in brackets and informal names in quotes.
